President Farmer called a regular meeting of the Mason County PUD No. 3 board of commissioners to order at 10:00 a.m. The meeting was held in the PUD 3 auditorium (Skookum Room) at 2621 E Johns Prairie Road in Shelton, Washington, on Tuesday, November 12, 2019.

STAFF REPORT

Mrs. Creekpaum stated that PUD 3 recognized Veterans Day on November 11, 2019. She thanked all Veterans for their service and sacrifices to keep our country safe.

^{*}Vouchers audited and certified by the district auditing officer as required by RCW 42.24.080, and those expense reimbursement claims certified as required by RCW 42.24.090, have been recorded on a listing which has been made available to the board.

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Mrs. Creekpaum announced that American Public Power Association (APPA) awarded designation as a Smart Energy Provider to PUD 3. At Mrs. Creekpaum's request, Mrs. Buck provided information about the award. She stated that PUD 3 received the designation in the inaugural class of the program, along with 67 utilities across the nation. The APPA recognized the PUD for its commitment and expertise in energy efficiency, encouragement of distributed energy generation, customer education and communications, and environmental programs that support the goal of providing low-cost, quality, safe, and reliable electric service. Three other public utilities in Washington State received recognition.

Mrs. Creekpaum reported the Totten substation footings have been poured and construction remains on target for energizing in March 2020.

Mrs. Creekpaum stated that she will be attending the Northwest River Partners, NoaNet, Public Power Council (PPC), Northwest Requirements Utilities (NRU) and Pacific Northwest Utilities Conference Committee (PNUCC) meetings this week.

Mrs. Creekpaum stated that she and Mrs. Speaks will be interviewing bond underwriters to begin the process of bond refunding.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

Ms. Gott reported that she attended the Northwest Public Power Association (NWPPA) Women in Public Power conference. The keynote speakers were exceptional, including PUD 3 employee, Tina Ward, who provided a motivational presentation on personal and business growth during her PUD 3 career.

Mr. Farmer reported that he attended the North Mason Chamber and Western Public Agency Group (WPAG) meetings.
